Lenten Regulations for the Diocese of Lincoln for 2024
Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

<u>Fasting</u> means eating only one full meal with two smaller meals, which together do not equal the full meal. No snacking or eating between meals is allowed. Fasting obliges all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. <u>Abstinence</u> means eating no meat, and no soup or gravy made from meat. Abstinence obliges all Catholics over the age of 14. Sickness, hard manual labor, pregnancy, etc. automatically excuse a person from these obligations.

Nevertheless, it should be pointed out that these are serious obligations. In cases of doubt or question, the priest who hears a person's confession should be consulted.

Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary/Assumption Parishioners,

During the season of Lent, we sing three Latin Mass parts: Holy Holy Holy (Sanctus), Memorial Acclamation and Lamb of God (Agnus Dei). With Vatican II, we were encouraged to retain the familiarity with the tradition of knowing and being able to sing the Latin Mass parts. Because Latin is still the universal language of the Catholic Church and the Church has prayed in Latin for 2,000 years, we should have the ability to sing these Mass parts and know what we are singing. Today, we will cover the Acclamation of Faith. The Memorial Acclamation is the verse

that we say or sing following the consecration. We will also practice this weekend, before Masses to help familiarize ourselves with these parts.

The priest sings or says:

Mysterium fidei! Literally: *Mysterium* = the mystery; *fidei* = of faith. The Mystery of Faith!

We all respond:

Mortem tuam annuntiamus, Domine, et tuam resurrectionem confitemur, donec venias.

Mortem tuam annuntiamus, Domine,

We proclaim Your death, O Lord,

et tuam resurrectionem confitemur,

and confess Your resurrection,

donec venias.

until You come.
