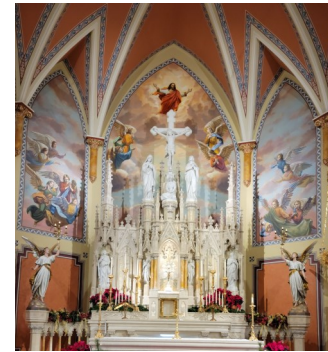

Pastor’s Corner
Dear St. Mary’s Parishioners,
All of the sudden it is August, and the hot week of weather is behind us. We have been blessed again with some beautiful rainfall. On Tuesday at the St Joseph’s Court, I mentioned that we should offer the Mass in “Thanksgiving to God” for the rainfall and I got a lot of affirmation, and so I did. Last week, I was in Ludington, Michigan with my brother’s family vacationing. It is kind of like a boot camp because he loves to be active. We biked, played 54 holes of golf and about 10 matches of tennis, walked and jumped in Lake Michigan each day.
