

O Antiphons: Composed in the sixth or seventh century, the O Antiphons are used in vespers (evening prayer) and the Masses for December 17-23. Each begins with a title for Christ, drawn from the Book of Isaiah, and the first letters of the titles in Latin are SARCORE. Read backward, that is *ero cras*, which means "Tomorrow I come" (or "shall be"). (Traditionally, feasts were set to begin on the eve of their celebration, so [Christmas](#) begins at sundown on Christmas Eve.)

Pastor’s Corner

Dear St Mary & Assumption Parishioners,

We are all probably busy getting ready for Christmas. It seems as soon as I do one thing, I think of another left undone. I love hearing from friends and family at this time of the year. Many of the cards I wait to open until after Christmas, when I can savor a card by the tree or fire-place with a cup of coffee or hot chocolate.

The daily readings in the week prior to Christmas, really help us prepare for the coming Birthday. In the Gospels we read the Annunciation, the Visitation, the genealogy of Christ, the announcement of the Birth of John the Baptist, the visit of Gabriel to Joseph, the birth of John the Baptist, the canticle of Zechariah and more. It all leads to the Birth of Our Savior and helps us build in anticipation of Christmas.

Just as our preparation for Christmas is special with lots of traditions, more so is our celebration of the coming Christmas Octave and whole season of Christmas. I will never forget a few years ago (7) when my priest friend in KCKS, Fr. McDonald at Holy Angels in Basehor, KS organized a Marian tour of Churches in KCMO for us to pray a decade at, sing a Christmas song, and receive a little history from the pastor or a parishioner during the Octave. We visited the Immaculate Conception Cathedral (downtown), Our Lady of Sorrows (Crown Center), Our Lady of Perpetual Help (Redemptorist), Our Lady of Good Counsel (Westport), Visitation (my home parish, near Plaza). My father, with Parkinson’s, went with me and the group of 20 and enjoyed it immensely (he knew all the churches very well). Afterwards, we went for lunch at the Rozelle Court in the Nelson Atkins Museum of Art, near the Plaza. It was a once in a life faith event that I often treasure this coming time of the year.

I enjoyed seeing the elementary school Christmas program at the High School this past week. I learn more of the children each year, which makes it more meaningful. In addition to the beautiful singing of Christmas and seasonal songs, the 4th and 5th graders did a very nice job playing their instruments. It was very impressive for their age. I also enjoy listening to them play the piano and other instruments before the concert. The new feature for this old school boy, was hearing the older students recite poetry they had memorized. Robert Frost’s Walking through the woods on a snowy evening was one that I was fortunate to learn at KU in the Humanities program. They also recited the lengthy Twas the night before Christmas.... Young people have amazing memories and I think it is wonderful for them to memorize wholesome, beautiful, classic poetry and songs, so they have them in their hearts all their life long.

Our campaign continues to be a blessing for the future of our parish. We have received \$141,300 in funds already and pledges now totally \$771,265. I open each one and am so edified with the sacrificial giving, commitment, faith and love which these are given. They are coming in from young and old and everyone in between. Please take a gander at the enclosed list and say a prayer of thanksgiving for what we have accomplished thus far. I apologize if you just recently received your campaign envelope. Some got delayed for various reasons, but I think they are all out now.

We are very thankful for all the cookies, chocolates, kolache, hoska, chocolate pretzels, and goodies we have been enjoying. We are also very grateful for the invites for meals. It is nice to join families and see the children.
