



Pastor's Corner

Dear St Mary's and Assumption parishioners,

It has been a big week. Sunday, our Harvest Festival an enjoyable celebration. Several people who came from out of town, mentioned how well organized and efficiently everything runs. They especially noticed the children doing a nice job serving the tables. That was nice to hear. We are happy to have served 1,058 which is the largest number in five years (prior to Covid we had three years in mid 1300s). I thought the food was delicious. I enjoyed the leftovers for five days and loved having turkey vegetable soup and turkey omelets. The auction was a success. I feel a bit guilty for buying one item below cost but don't want to run things up myself. The day is fast and fun. Thanks to everyone who did their own part so well, donated auction items, baked items, bid and bought items, Buresh meats and catering for good cooking, set up, clean up and the HF committee who make it all happen.

Tuesday, we went to the polls. Suffice to say, I like how Butler County votes. When I went to bed, the ballot initiative was losing. I was so glad to wake up and see the 434 passed and 439 failed to pass. Thanks be to God. While this initiative is not perfect, we defeated a potentially serious constitutional amendment that was deceptive and very pro-abortion.

On Tuesday, we had a funeral for Maxine Aerts who was born in 1921 and died at 103 years old. She lived in the St. Joseph's Court for several years, so I saw her almost every week for Friday Mass. I recall in 1993 when she invited me for coffee and toast on her porch one morning as I walked north up 5th street. We were connected ever since and I saw a lot of her at Masses and activities over the years. She had 10 children (eight still living), 34 grandchildren, 67 greatgrandchildren and four GGGC. She loved children up to the very last days of her life. We thank God for her faithful, family and God centered life.

I want to say a few words about our campaign, which continues to gain momentum. I sat down with Joe Akers to review his numbers for what we will ask people to give. We are asking for a high number in hopes of a successful campaign. We do not know people's financial situation, nor do we need to know. We are asking based on your past generosity to St Mary's and the Centered on Christ campaign for the combined restoration of the Church and Joy of the Gospel in 2015. People gave very generously to these important causes. I feel the current campaign is also very important for financial stability. My prayer is that nobody is offended by the asking number. My hope and prayer is that everyone prayerfully looks at how God has blessed your family and what God is asking you to give. It is an act of faith. This weekend, we have the Gospel of the widow's mite. She gave from her want and not from her excess. She is an inspiration to all of us and there are lots of people in our parish who likewise give very generously. God bless you all, FBC
