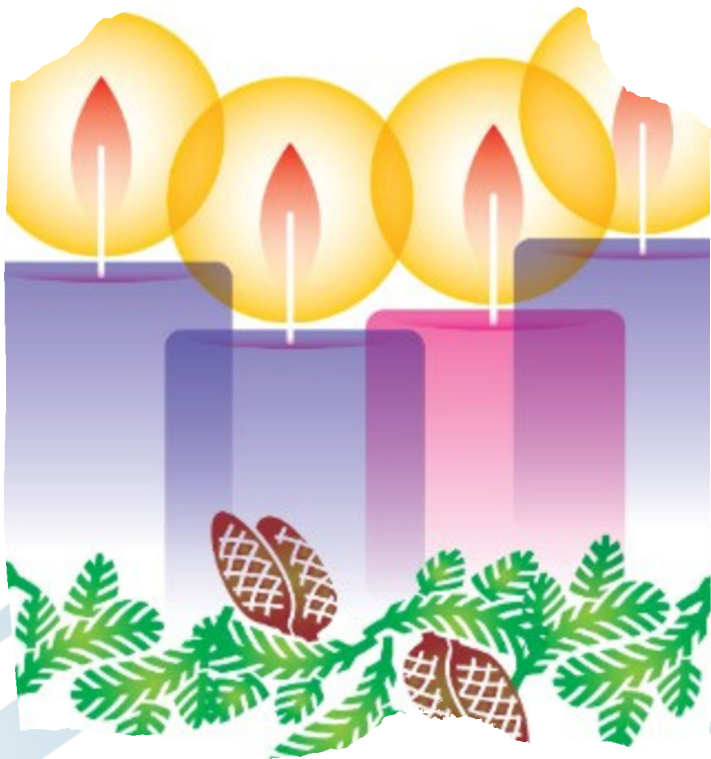

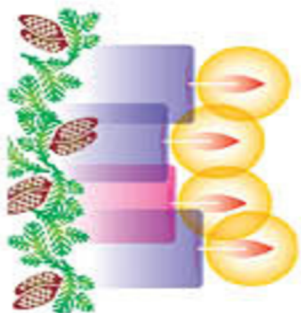
## UNBOUND January RETREAT 16-18
