

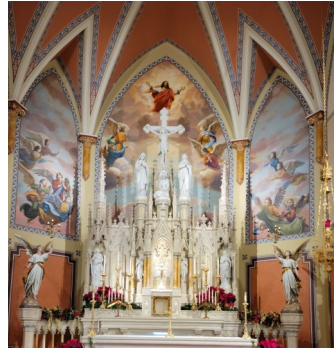

Pastor’s Corner

Dear St. Mary and Assumption Parishioners,
I am in a very grateful mood as I think of our strong spirit of volunteering to do things for God around parish. I will just give you a few examples today and come back to this topic again soon.
Last weekend, we had Bishops Appeal for Vocations Sunday with pledge cards in the gym. I learned early on that food attracts and walking all the way across the parking lot to make a pledge was not enticing to anyone. For the past couple years, we have offered a hot breakfast for those families who come make the pledge on BAV Sunday. I had my list of 20 whom I asked to bring something, but only had about six “yeses” officially. I got nervous but trusted that people would come through. I had asked those who indicated they would be willing to bring food for special functions on our Stewardship brochure last year. And, praise God, they came delivered in grand fashion. We had to set up more tables and it was a very successful BAV Sunday. Thanks for all helped in various ways.
Every other week, four ladies come a help clean the rectory. While we try to keep the house tidy, they vacuum, dust, do bathrooms and bedding and make it look lovely again. It is a humble service where we really feel the love and care from them. Their chatter fills the rectory and we are so grateful they have given of their time and talents.
Every Thursday our grass gets mowed and ready for Sunday Mass by Allen Steinberger. As you know, God has blessed us with lovely rains this year, so we haven’t had to water it too much and I think the stand of grass looks great.
Monday morning Patty Vaca and Marlene Hein come and count the collection. They do a great job and enjoy their time together and our interruptions. Also, Mark Chermok comes each Monday helps with the bulletin. How fortunate we are to have so many people giving of their time and talents to keep things operating around here. Jesus says “the greatest amongst you is the one who serves the rest”. I am glad that St Mary’s has so many ways to require service of others. Many parishes hire out these type of services, but we depend upon countless people to give generously of themselves. God bless you all.
On Monday, I invited Msgr. Herbek and the retired priests for dinner at the rectory. They look forward to coming out for something on the grill.
