



We are seeing the completion of some long-awaited deferred maintenance projects on our beautiful Church. The last three months have seen the parking lot resealed, the new handrails on the Church and recently the curbs and stairs repairs and stairs recoated by Hello Garage. We also had the patio in the back of the rectory expanded and are doing some improved landscaping behind the rectory. I am aware of a couple more projects that need attention but am hoping we are getting ahead of the needs. As always, I appreciate the Parish Council's input and special helpers along the way. Doris Redler has been a big help on these and Dan Smith is always around to pitch in.

I have been reading Cardinal Pell's Prison Journal. It is very interesting as he is a great historian and writer, conservative and opinionated. Although he was in solitary confinement, unjustly incarcerated, he was able to carry on a very productive life. One of the hardest things for him was to not have the ability to offer daily Mass or receive communion, apart from when a religious sister brought Jesus to him. He was very kind to the wardens and so they responded in good manner. He understood that prisons are not supposed to favor the incarcerated and everything favors the system. He was able to have six books in his possession (brievery one), a couple periodicals, a chance to exercise daily and have some visitors. He received an average of 25 letters a day including five from other prisoners. He reads each correspondence and responds with hope, charity and counsel to many of them. He found the brievery very comforting as it keeps him active with the life of the Church and the psalms and readings speak to him even more powerfully than at other times. I enjoyed the book to learn how this famous Archbishop (Sydney and Melbourne) and Cardinal managed to keep his spirits up during this very challenging time. After over a year his appeal was accepted, and he was set free. Unfortunately, he died about a year later at age of 82.
