Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary and Assumption Parishioners,

Happy Labor Day weekend. I hope you are satisfied that your labor, job and opportunities are a good use of your God given strengths. The first Labor Day parade in New York was in 1882. And the Federal holiday was adopted on June 28, 1894, when President Grover Cleveland signed a law making the first Monday in September of each year a national holiday. We recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and wellbeing. Work gives dignity and meaning to our days. Work provides for our families and builds up the community and the church. Work allows us to provide for the needs of others near and far.
