

Dear St. Mary/Assumption Parishioners,

In this past week, 110 parishioners have turned in their Stewardship Commitment cards. These are a tremendous help to me as pastor to know who is willing to help in various ways for the good of the Church. We will look at them closely and use the information. We are very blessed with a history of so many people giving of their time, talents, and treasure sacrificially. That is very evident as I look around and review the cards. Our Harvest Festival and Adoration are two huge efforts that involve hundreds of people. Please turn in your Stewardship Commitment Cards this weekend if you have not already.

Our census was up fifteen people from last year's census from 470-485. Hopefully, more people will come to Holy Mass and worship God in Word and Sacrament. Please invite and encourage your family and friends. We will be counting people again this weekend for the diocesan wide annual census. We need our faith as much as ever it seems with the breakdown of families, world wars, drugs, and many problems.

We will be having the Offertory/ collection brought forth along with the gifts of bread and wine in the future. This liturgical moment is a beautiful sign and reality of the many gifts that you offer each day to keep the local Church alive.
