Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary and Assumption Parishioners,

We had an exciting week. Our Marian Birthday Holy Hour for Healing was well attended. I want to thank all who came and prayed and Madelyn Emory (8th grader at AHS) who made both the chocolate and vanilla cakes.

OCIA began last week and God willing we will have some more people join the classes in the weeks ahead. Please help us pray and recruit. Think of the joy of Easter Vigil how good we feel when someone joins the church and is Baptized and is able to receive the Most Holy Eucharist.

This past Thursday we celebrated the feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary. I thought this from Magnificat was worth sharing with you.

St. Louis de Montfort wrote that 'the salvation of each individual is bound up with the Hail Mary.' Why? Because it was taken when the Archangel greeted Mary that our Savior became flesh in her womb. To be Christian is to carry on that Annunciation by repeating the Hail Mary. This prayer, which speaks the holy name of the Mother of God, 'brought to a dry and barren world the Fruit of Life. It will cause the Word of God to take root in the soul and bring forth Jesus.' The holy name of Mary bears such power because of the unique bond between Mother and Son. 'When god sent his Son born of a Woman, He instituted a once-and-for-all order of salvation in which the union of Mother and Child stands at the center.' (Fr. Romanus Cessario, O.P.)
