Dear St. Mary & Assumption Parishioners:

Last Sunday, I was able to attend the 25th anniversary celebration for Sr. Janelle Buettner, Sr. Melissa Moxley and Mother Ann Marie Zierke at the Motherhouse in Waverly. I have known all these wonderful sisters and had Sr Janelle as our principal for 9 years at North American Martyrs. The day began with Mass, followed by a nice brunch with the Marian Sisters, jubilarians, their families and a few priests. Afterwards, three sisters gave a talk celebrating each of them which provided plenty of laughter. Then they had a 12 minute video with baby pictures, family pics, graduations, professions and their ministry in the diocese and beyond. Afterwards, they prepared for the Open House to which several hundred loving friends came to show their joy with the jubilarians. It was so nice to be surrounded by their loving community and see the 100-fold reward the friends received in the Church when we leave it all to follow Christ in imitation of St Francis and the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Fr. Barnhill, who is a few years older than me, said he remembered these families in the 80s at St Mary's Old Cathedral. All three of them we very involved in Youth Ministry. It struck me that God must be very pleased with parents who devote themselves above and beyond their families, so help grow the faith of other young people, so much as to bring a consecrated religious sister into their families.


If there are any parents wanting to help with youth ministry at St Mary's or Appleton, please contact me. I know that we are always big into support of our Catholic Schools, and that they do many wonderful things with our youth. We also have CCD (starting Sept 3). But, parish Youth Ministry has not been strong of late. It takes young couples to succeed.

On another different matter, I am very happy to include a summary of our Endowment Fund in the Flocknote email. You will see that we have had excellent growth in the past three years due to a major gift from Phillis Lukassen and \$300,000 from your donations to our recent campaign (HOPSOF). The value is over \$2.5 million. Fortunately, at 5% we will receive about \$125,000 in distributions this coming year (up \$20K from 24-25). Also, we have our St Mary's Fund, which has been established and has about \$40,000 invested thus far from Campaign donations. This is also invested with the Catholic Foundation of Southern Nebraska, just like the other endowments, but is liquid, and so we can draw from it when needed. Thanks to all of you who are writing checks to the 'St Mary's Parish Fund" to build this up.

On the graph, you can see that value has grown by \$393,938 over the years, above and beyond what has been invested and the distributions of over \$1M. We are not able to withdraw from that value over principal (I thought I could a year ago).

I have decided to not include the summary total of the Sunday collection each week in the bulletin. I will still report what we receive, but I think the fact that we get behind and remain behind the whole year is a downer and depressing. I would rather be grateful for the sacrificial gifts, overjoyed that there are people who tithe, happy that parishioners are making steps towards tithing, growing in faith thru what they give of their money (income, salary, investments, SS, retirement....). I want to make a paradigm shift and try to trust more in God, that he will provide for our parish and take the weekly worry, downer out and just know, that God will not abandon us, our needs, and that he will help people grow in stewardship and take care of us.

Everyone knows that we have a significant need to receive stewardship (gifts of time, talent and treasure) from our dear people, and that the need to give is always greater than the need to receive. God bless you and yours, Fr. Brian Connor
