Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary and Assumption Parishioners,

School has started and so many are back in that routine. This Sunday, we will have coffee and rolls in the gym after both Masses. We have Parish Council on Monday at 6:30pm in the Didier Room. You are welcome to bring any concerns to me or the parish council members listed on the front of the bulletin. We meet every third Monday.

We are in week four of five on the Bread of Life discourse from John 6. It should have extra meaning in this central year of the Eucharistic Revival. "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For My flesh is true food and My blood is true drink. Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood remains in Me and I in him." (John 6:53-56)

You could say that these words are the reason that we have OCIA, Alpha, Bible Studies, Theology on Tap and all our other parish efforts. We want people to come to the Sacraments and especially to Jesus in the Bread of Life. We want them to encounter Him in the Living Word, in others, in the Sacraments, and especially in the Holy Eucharist.
